- To enhance the climate knowledge and capacity of farmer organisations in East Africa through learning workshops and technical guidance;
- To conduct research and build technical partnerships to strengthen the engagement of farmers in climate change policy and climate negotiations;
- To develop farmer-led policy research to assess the impact of policy decisions on farmers (such as the implications of the EU's Green Deal on farmers);
- To formulate and communicate common positions amongst farmer organisations in preparation for important climate policy windows;
- To build farmer knowledge and capacity to increase access and uptake of climate finance.



EAFF is proud of its accomplishments to date:



Development of a number of strategic partnerships with technical experts in the field of climate change.

Active engagement in climate policy discussions and highprofile events


